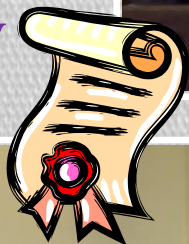

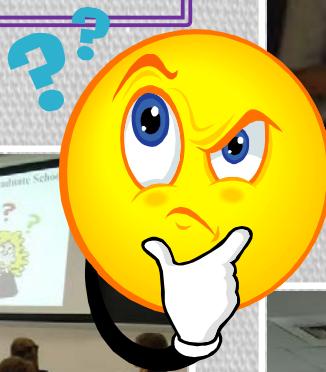
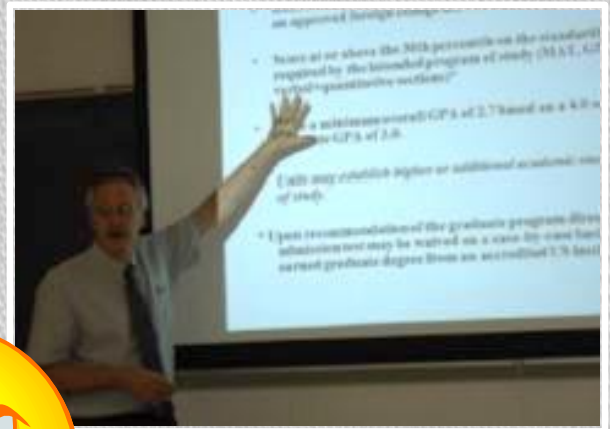
Movie Night At Dr. Tilley's

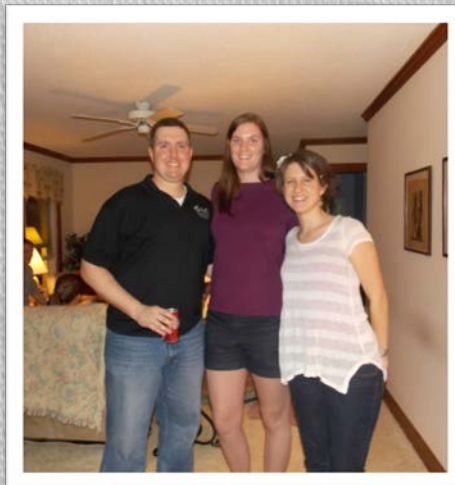




Chili Night at Chez Dudley



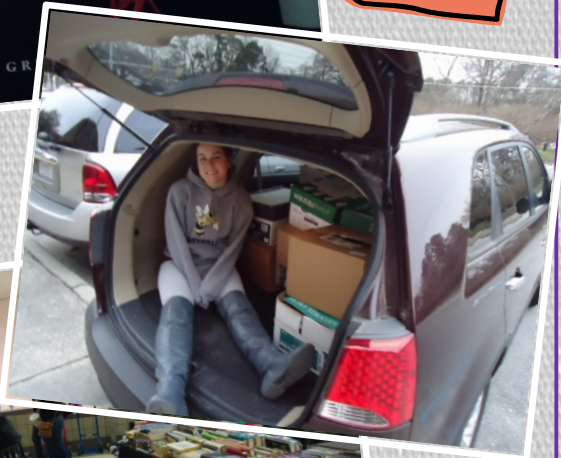

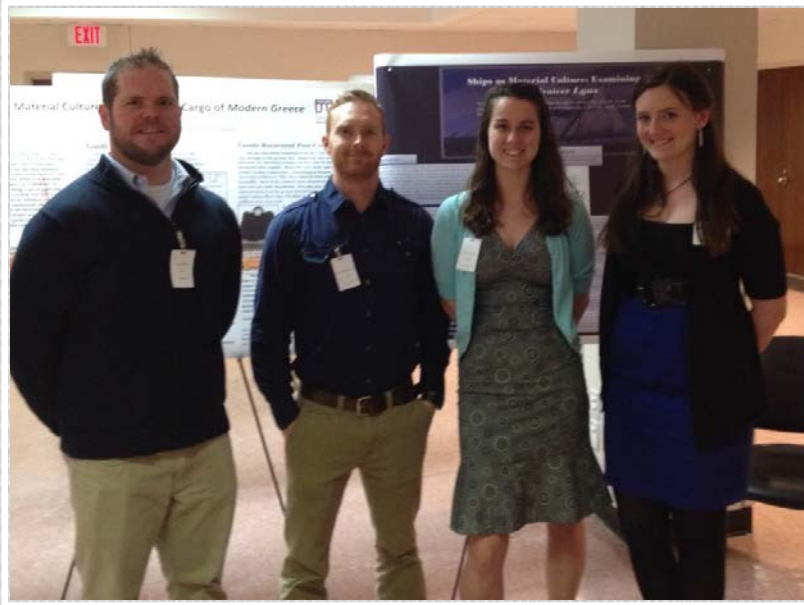


Annual Book Sale

East Carolina University's Research and Creativity Week

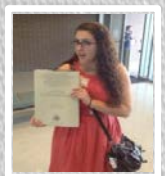
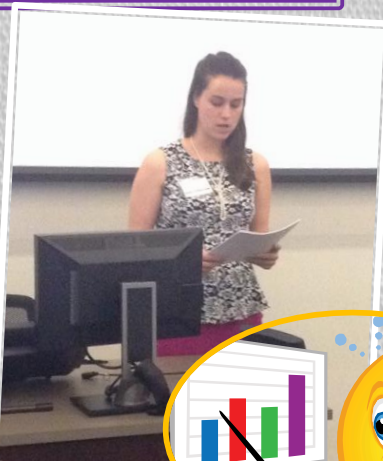

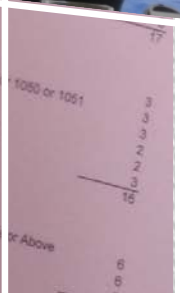
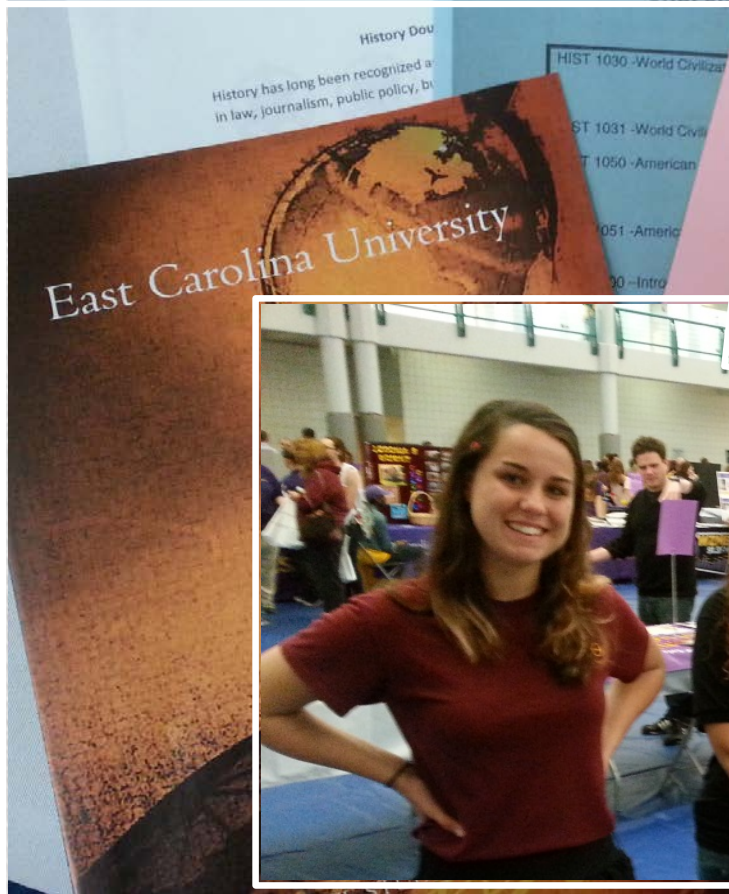
Throughout the year, our chapter successfully recruited a quality group of new members dedicated to the scholarship and field of history. Our leadership team understands that membership growth is essential to success.

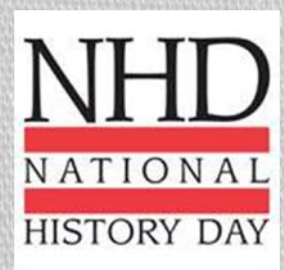
National History Day

Each year, more than half a million middle and high school students participate in the National History Day contest. National History Day is a renowned academic program in which participating students are given a theme and then choose a related historical topic and conduct extensive primary and secondary research through libraries, archives, museums, oral history interviews and historic sites. These middle and secondary students then analyze and interpret their sources, draw conclusions about their topic's historical significance, and compile their findings in original papers, websites, exhibits, performances and documentaries.

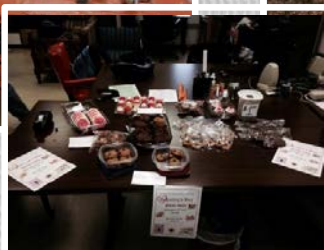




Relay For Life



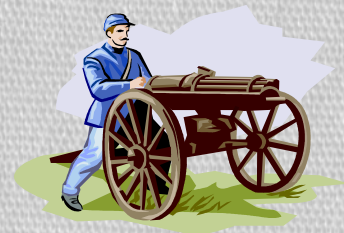

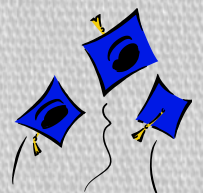


Graduation: May 9, 2014

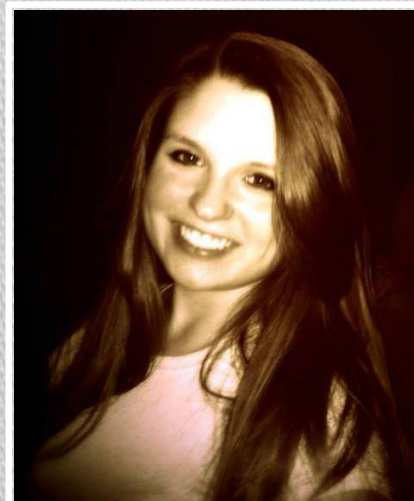
Graduation was a time of celebration, and a showcase of the success and achievement of Lambda-Eta members.

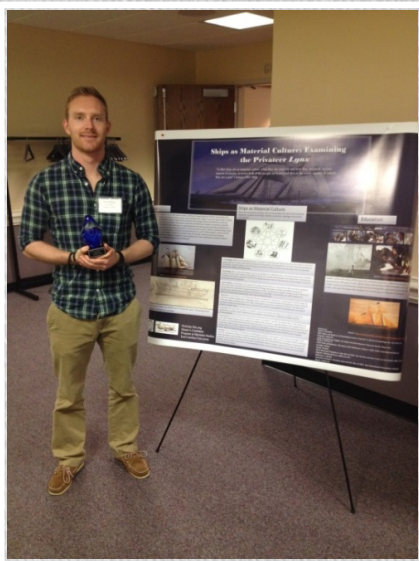
